Now here's a popup you won't want to miss – it's stylish, different from anything else you'd find in Miami, and exotic. Called [Atelier Nomads](#), it features the

one-of-a-kind furniture, decor, textiles and chic artisanal crafts that dot the villas and riads of Morocco. It runs from now through July 24.

Mindy McIlroy, president of commercial real estate powerhouse Terranova, launched this pop-up in Coral Gables (348 Miracle Mile) together with [Maryam Montague](#), a designer, author and hotelier, whom she met on a shopping trip abroad in Morocco.

Everything reflects their fine taste and sense of style. Accessories start at \$25, while big-ticket items such as rugs range from \$2,400 to \$7400 dependent on size. There are also large hand embroidered palm raffia rugs for \$950.

Inside Atelier Nomads, every small-batch, chosen item is handmade and tells a story, with a focus on the people behind the design. This first capsule collection features one-of-a-kind pieces that elevate the home, such as hand-knotted rugs; hand-embroidered chairs covered in sublime raffia tapestry; handcrafted furniture like communal tables, side tables, bar carts and large raffia lanterns; pottery, baskets, sculptures and even decorative tiles that are intended to make an impact in a room.

Those looking for unique gifts will discover: handblown glassware in various shapes and hues; handcrafted baskets; bespoke backgammon games; and a range of candles and home fragrances housed in covetable vessels. [MILA Omakase](#) on Lincoln Road in South Beach is bringing back its intimate Sushi Masterclass—a curated experience that invites guests behind the counter to explore the precision, technique, and beauty of Japanese culinary artistry.

The class will be hosted once a month with upcoming dates June 17 and July 22, from 7 to 9PM, with only ten seats available per session. More Miami Events in June 2025

Waves of Style – Swimwear through The Decades, is an enticing exhibit now at the HistoryMiami Museum downtown. Dive into the vibrant world of swimwear! This immersive experience invites visitors of all ages to explore the history and transformation of swimwear through engaging visuals, interactive elements, and historic swimwear pieces showcasing the art and evolution of swim fashion. Interact, imagine, and create by designing your own swimwear while delving into the societal influences that shape our perceptions of swimwear. Now to October 5, 2025

ICA Miami in the Miami Design District, in collaboration with the prestigious [Fondation Cartier pour l'art contemporain](#), has a major retrospective of the work of famed Colombian artist Olga de Amaral, bringing together more than 50 works from six decades, and featuring recent and historical examples, some of which have never been presented outside of her home country. The presentation at ICA Miami follows a tremendous success in Paris at the Fondation Cartier.

It reveals the breadth and complexity of Amaral's practice, highlighting crucial periods in the development of her career as she moved from colorful explorations of the grid to experiments with materiality and scale.

Amaral's sculptures and installations push the boundaries of fiber art, often combining weaving, knotting, and braiding to create striking abstract three-dimensional forms. Her earliest explorations, from the 1960s, frequently take inspiration from nature and feature unconventional weaving techniques. During the 1970s, Amaral created a group of monumental wall works; superimposing constructed layers of wool and horsehair enabled her to work at scale, evoking brick walls, leaves, and geological layers. Her investigations would also lead her to experiment with paint, linen, cotton, gesso, gold leaf, and palladium.

While you're at ICA don't miss the exhibit of the work of Ugandan artist Sanaa Gateja. He does tapestries made from beads that were in turn made from recycled paper that is dyed through a laborious process and then made into beads. In the image closeup I took you can see hints of the former life of the papers.

Another exhibit well worth a visit especially if you're a Japan lover is at the [Frost Art Museum](#) — work of Hiromi Mizugai Moneyhun whose intricate paper-cut drawings merge traditional Japanese art forms—particularly *kirie*—with folkloric motifs and contemporary Japanese culture. Besides finding the art itself intriguing, I learned fascinating new things about Japanese culture from the exhibit descriptions that I'd never heard anywhere else. The exhibit runs until September 28.

Miami Beach Classical Music Festival (MMF), a nonprofit dedicated to providing affordable, world-class musical instruction and groundbreaking performance experiences to young artists and the South Florida community, returns for its 2025 summer series, from now through August 31 in Miami Beach at select locations. New this year, MMF is unveiling Miami Beach's first permanent immersive theater—transforming the grand ballroom of Temple Emanu-El into a state-of-the-art venue where 360-degree projection mapping surrounds audiences in sight and sound.

The annual fireworks show and concert presented by the Ocean Drive Association and the City of Miami Beach will feature a performance at 8:30 p.m. by the MMF Symphony Orchestra and Alumni Division singers conducted by MMF founder and artistic director Michael Rossi. Celebrate the holiday listening to Broadway favorites and patriotic music, including Tchaikovsky's bombastic 1812 Overture, the Armed Forces Salute, "The Stars and Stripes Forever" and more. The performance will be accompanied by fireworks at 9 p.m. Attendees are encouraged to make reservations at one of the many alfresco ocean-view restaurants nearby or bring beach chairs, blankets and picnics.

The next generation of symphonic conductors trains at MMF's Conducting Institute. These emerging artists study all aspects of the art of conducting with acclaimed faculty and gain valuable experience leading a full orchestra while being coached. Institute fellows then have an opportunity to show off their artistry in a public concert. See MMF Institute fellows perform in Miami Beach as they perform pieces by Mozart, Haydn and Beethoven.

One of Mozart's most beloved works gets a classic retelling, bringing to Miami the music and characters that have captured the hearts of opera lovers all over the world. Servants Figaro and his promised Susanna prepare for their upcoming wedding, only to find that his employer, the Count, has impure intentions for her as well. Fearing that the Count will reinstate the ancient First Night rite to rendezvous with her, Figaro sets about scheming to outsmart him. Meanwhile, the lovely Countess, to

whom Susanna is ever faithful, begins to suspect the same and devises her own trap to catch him in his mischief. The classes battle in a light-hearted comedy sung in Italian by the MMF Opera Institute, which features some of Mozart's most beautiful melodies ever written.

In Dvořák's spellbinding masterpiece, a water nymph makes a heartbreaking bargain to become human and win the love of a mortal prince. With its lush, otherworldly score and the famous "Song to the Moon," *Rusalka* is a breathtaking tale of longing, sacrifice, and the high cost of desire.

In *The Ghosts of Versailles*, the spirits have literally come back to court; the court of Louis XVI that is. Marie Antoinette is upset about having been beheaded, so her favorite playwright attempts to entertain her by continuing the adventures of his characters from *The Barber of Seville* and *The Marriage of Figaro*. This opera-within-an-opera goes awry when Figaro refuses to stick to the script and the playwright must come to the Queen's rescue and win her affection.
